English language Proficiency Tests for University Admission

There are two main tests to test the proficiency of the English language. They are TOEFL- iBT / IELTS. In order to take these tests one must pass certain stages. These stages include:

- Reading
- Listening
- Speaking
- Writing

IELTS Structure

- The IELTS exam is marked out of 9 bands.
- There are 4 sections and each section is graded out of 9 bands.
- The test can be paper based or computer based.
- The sections of Reading and Listening are objective types.
- The sections of Writing and Speaking are subjective types.
- This test is accepted by all countries all over the world.

TOEFL Structure

- The TOEFL exam is marked out of 120 points.
- Each Section is graded out 30 points and is totalled to 120.
- In India , TOEFL is administered in iBT Format Only.
- The sections of Reading and Listening are objective types.
- The sections of Writing and Speaking are subjective types.
- TOEFL is primarily accepted by the USA.



IELTS

- It is either paper based or computer based.
- Each section and overall is marked out of 9 bands.
- The Speaking section Happens on a different day and Reading, Listening, Writing on the same Day.
- There is no negative marking.
- Results are shared within 10 days.
- The test is conducted by IDP.
- The exam fee is 15,500 INR.
- The speaking section happens in an interview format.

TOEFL

- It is only Internet based.
- The whole section is marked out of 120 points with each section being marked out of 30 marks
- All the sections happen on the same day.
- There is no negative marking.
- Results are shared within 10-15 days.
- The test is conducted by ETS.
- The exam fee is 190 USD/15,500 INR.
- The speaking section happens in a recording format.

IELTS Exam format

Listening

There are 40 questions that are to be answered in 30 minutes.

- 1. It is based on a multiple choice format.
- 2. The test includes diagram labeling, sentence completion and summary completion.

Reading

- 1. There are 40 questions that are to be answered in 60 minutes.
- 2. It is based on a multiple choice format.
- 3. The test includes matching features, matching headings, sentence completion and summary completion.

Writting

- There are 2 questions that are to be answered in 60 minutes.
- 2. There are two writing tasks.

Speaking

- 1. The test is of 11-14 minutes.
- 2. There are three parts in this section.

TOEFL Exam Format

• Reading There are 30-40 questions that are to be answered in 54-72 minutes.

• Listening There are 30-40 questions that are to be answered in 41-57 minutes.

• Speaking There are 4 questions that are to be answered in 17 minutes.

• Writing There are 2 questions that are to be answered in 50 minutes.



Important Factors

• Which exam to choose?

Choose as per the requirement of the University or the format with which you are comfortable.

• Timeline

Plan to take the test within 1-3 months before your application for Jan/Sep Opens.

• Level of Difficulty

Both the tests are almost equal when it comes to level of difficulty however because of the format of Speaking/Writing one may appear more difficult than the other.

• Importance

While the tests do not alter your chance of getting an admit , it is critical to score a minimum to be eligible for any school.

• Preparation

These tests are easy and do not have any specific syllabus so all you need is a time bound practice.

• What is a good score? IELTS- No Section less than 6.5 and over all 7 TOEFL- No Section less than 20 and overall 95


